Thank you for your request dated 20 November 2017 under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA). For ease of reference you asked for:

"I would like full details of the following:

- 1) Data on each time a drone was reported being used in or around a HMP Perth or HMP Castle Huntly in the last three years up to the most recent date possible.
- 2) The date that its use was reported, at which prison and a brief summary of what happened during the incident.
- **3)** If the drone or anything the drone was carrying was recovered, please provide a list of its cargo.
- 4) State if any action was taken by the prison as a result of the reported use of a drone."

Response to requests for information 1, 2 and 3: The tables below provide a breakdown of incidents linked to drones or UAVs recorded on the SPS Prison Records System (PR2) between May 2016 and November 2017, broken down by calendar year and establishment.

If you are not satisfied with the result of the review, you then have the right to make a formal complaint to the Scottish Information Commissioner.
