

DIRECTIONS

The Scottish Prison Rules (Religious Observance) Direction 2024

Made - - - - 21 December 2023
Coming into force - - 1st January 2024

The Scottish Ministers make the following Direction in exercise of the powers conferred by section 39 of the Prisons (Scotland) Act 1989(1) and rules 83 and 156 of the Prisons and Young Offenders Institutions (Scotland) Rules 2011(2) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. This Direction may be cited as the Scottish Prison Rules (Religious Observance) Direction 2024 and comes into force on 1 January 2024.

Recognised days of religious observance

2. For the purpose of rule 83(3)(b) of the Prisons and Young Offenders Institutions (Scotland) Rules 2011—
- (a) the recognised days of religious observance for each religion specified in column 1 of the Schedule are described in column 2 of the Schedule; and
 - (b) the dates on which those days fall in 2024 are specified in column 3 of the Schedule.
